Thanks for re-sending this message as I have not been accessing the NIH email account frequently as I am now on an assignment at the FDA through May. It may be better to contact me at raymond.dionne@icloud.com as I monitor that frequently each day. I have been distracted from JPP due to my move from NIH to the FDA prior to retiring from Federal service later this year. But my major project at the FDA will involve pharmacogenomics related to analgesic drugs. I am also working with another group at the University of Pennsylvania who are developing methods to evaluate the individual variation related to NSAIDs with an emphasis on their adverse effects. I am no longer directly involved with my research group at NIH other than to finish up several manuscripts, but none of these related to pharmacogenomics. I would like to draft a review article first on the pharmacogenomics of analgesic drugs (opioids, NSAIDs, acetaminophen, etc) for submission to JPP. I can also start to invite authors working in the field to submit manuscripts that are appropriate to JPP. I should have something that is based on my current projects later in the year to submit. I will plan on submitting the review article by the end of February and keep you informed of progress on soliciting manuscripts as well. Ray Dionne
