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Neurosarcoidosis: An overlooked diagnostic dilemma

2 cases of neurosarcoidosis were reported, it is a rare disease, primary care physicians and neurologists have very limited exposure to this pathology, and published data till date is limited to few case series and case reports. There is also lack of enough demographical data of this illness in different regions around the globe, similarly there is absence of definitive diagnostic criterion for neurosarcoidosis, and so it is often misdiagnosed and overlooked by clinicians due to identical clinical findings in other pathologies. This paper will review the presentation of two case reports and also highlight atypical presentations of this pathology that could potentially be an aid to literature till date.
