Since each report to be cumulatively released online covers 45 days from the date of receipt. The time span is taken from 4 to 5 weeks for various processes including quality assurance, peer review and paper preparation. Performance reviews and peer review procedures are done within 14 days, and the deadline for submission is just 7 days after approval by the reviewers and editors. CNS received 2 research article and 1 case report in issue 1 of volume 3. Globally, CNS announces Conferences every year and is going to accomplish in Toronto, Canada. . Journal uses online broadcasting and various social media channels such as Twitter, LinkedIn, and Facebook for recent updates on what's going on in the newspaper to make people aware of the Cancer Surgery-related topical issues. In JPMC there are 25+ Million Website visitor. All papers written will be given DOI by CrossRef. Cancer Surgery will keep up-to-date with the latest developments in the field and papers published in Cancer Surgery will reach readers directly via email at no charge.
