- Fellowship programmes at a large children's medical centre are common for paediatric otolaryngologists to finish extra training.

Paediatric otolaryngologists work with children from the time they are born until they reach adolescence. They have chosen to make paediatric care the centre of their medical practise, and they have understood the particular nature of paediatric medical and surgical care via extensive training and practise.
